1. [Jasper National Park Information Centre](#) & [Friends of Jasper Gift Shop](#) – visit the historic JNP Info Centre, a Federal Heritage Building and National Historic Site, in the centre of town at 500 Connaught Street. While there, check out the Friends of Jasper National Park’s Gift Shop for a wide range of unique gifts and books.

2. [Jasper Yellowhead Museum](#) – spend a leisurely afternoon with a visit to the Jasper Yellowhead Museum, with exhibits on the fur trade, the railway, and early exploration and tourism in Jasper National Park. Don't forget to check out the great selection of items in the Gift Shop.

Historical Gallery - includes exhibits on the fur trade, the railway, and early exploration and tourism in Jasper National Park. Among our featured artefacts is Curly Phillips’ canoe, the ice axe from Mt. Alberta, and David Thompson’s musket balls recovered from Athabasca Pass.

Showcase & Alcove Galleries - These galleries feature exhibits which are culturally and historically significant to the area and change several times a year.

Gift Shop - features a wide selection of adult and children’s books, videos, artwork, and crafts by local and regional artists. The giftshop is in the museum.

3. **Jasper Skytram** - discover Jasper from new altitudes, with a flight and a walk at the top of Whistler Mountain!! Plan on 2-3 hours for your flights (up & down), walk/hike at the top, and some time in the gift shop. You are encouraged to book your tickets in advance, with children under 6 free. *For more info,* visit [Jasper Skytram website](#).

4. **Maligne Canyon & Valley Exploration** - one of the most stunning areas in Jasper National Park is Maligne Lake. If you have time, it’s a must see! Take a scenic drive through this

beautiful valley (48 km). Visit Maligne Canyon, pass a disappearing lake, take a lakeshore stroll or challenge yourself to a rewarding hike. *For more info*, visit [Parks Canada Summer in Jasper National Park](#).

5. Icefields Parkway Exploration to Athabasca Glacier – known as one of the world’s most scenic drives, the Icefields Parkway boasts exquisite and otherworldly scenery as you travel along the 230-km stretch between Jasper and Lake Louise. *For more info*, visit [Parks Canada-Icefields Parkway](#).

6. Scenic Drive & Visit Moberley Homestead Site (Metis) – a 2-3 hour scenic drive along the Snaring Road, enjoying panoramic views of the Athabasca Valley, and a short interpretive trail at the Moberly Homestead Site where you learn more about Metis connections to the Park. *For more info*, visit [Parks Canada Indigenous Connections](#).

7. Highway 93A Scenic Drive & Athabasca Falls Exploration - The 23-metre Athabasca Falls is not very high by Canadian Rockies standards, but the size of the river makes it one of the most powerful falls to be found in the mountain national parks. Follow this World Heritage River along Highway 93A from Jasper. *For more info*, visit [Parks Canada Athabasca Falls](#).
